Alternative Giving/Gifts of Grace Cards for Christmas

Are you having a hard time deciding on just the right gift for a special friend or loved one? Consider the gift that keeps on giving. The Outreach Committee will have a table in the Farthex starting on Sunday, December 4 until Sunday, December 18, 2016 with honor cards for purchase for \$10 each supporting the following ministries:

- 1. **Bread for the World:** A collective Christian voice urging our nation's decision-makers to end hunger at home and abroad by changing the policies, programs and conditions that allow hunger to continue.
- 2. **Heifer International:** A non-profit organization dedicated to ending hunger through providing livestock and training in environmentally sound agriculture to those with genuine need.
- 3. **Habitat for Humanity of Durham:** A non-profit organization that creates partnerships to build, restore and repair safe, decent and affordable homes for low income families.
- 4. **Hurricane Matthew Relief in NC:** This is the ministry focus for the NC Conference of the United Methodist Church this year. Many of our neighbors in the eastern part of our state are still struggling to recover from Matthew's flooding and devastation. 100% of your gifts go to the victims of Hurricane Matthew.
- 5. **Urban Ministries of Durham:** Provides food, shelter, clothing and supportive services to our neighbors in need.
- 6. **Families Moving Forward (formerly IHN):** Provides transitional housing and moves families into residential stability and self-sufficiency by mobilizing congregations and people of faith.
- 7. **Backpack Ministry:** Epworth's own program which provides food for the weekend for 50 children of need who attend Hope Valley Elementary School.
- 8. **Epworth United Methodist Church Ceiling Repair**: As we celebrate the birth of the Christ child in our newly repaired and repainted Sanctuary, please consider gifts to Epworth above and beyond your pledge this year to help pay for our Sanctuary repairs. We have raised \$41,000 to date and need an additional \$9000 to pay off the entire debt.
- 9. **Fond Doux Foundation:** A foundation created by Epworth United Methodist Church to assist families of Haiti to enjoy better nutrition and health through enriched foods and training to those with genuine need.
